What do we do and who do we serve?

- A Child's Place (ACP) is a specialized, intensive case management program for children and families experiencing homelessness.
- There are over 4,000 children and families experiencing homelessness in our community that we know about. Many others are not identified.
- ACP served nearly 300 families last fiscal year (pre-merger) and we are on track to serve nearly double that amount this fiscal year (post-merger).
- ACP works collaboratively with CMS and other key stakeholders to identify and engage with these families and help empower them towards housing stability.
- Masters level social workers engage and work with the heads of household multiple times per week to build their self-sufficiency, life-skills, and resilience. Additionally, the program has a licensed clinician dedicated to the program to support the ongoing mental health needs of families receiving services.

What is the goal of the program?

The long-term goal of the community-based program is to enhance the self-sufficiency of families and enable these individuals to locate and navigate resources available in the community without the help of a third-party referral agency.

What can the community do to help? What are the greatest needs?

Financial donations will make the greatest positive impact on the clients served in ACP. Community investments will support/provide:

- funds to assist with expenses gain housing (deposits, utilities, rent)
- funds to support basic needs (school uniforms, housewares)
